### Notes

General. Quite a lot of mistakes this time round, and no one was correct on all four controls. A couple of basic principles are worth mentioning: kites are referred to as A, B, C and so on from left to right; pay particular attention to control descriptions; and viewing the kites from various points up and down the route to the start is often essential in order to get the right answer, although on Sunday the route to the start was not particularly clear. Control 3 was a good example of how attention to detail is needed.

1. The control description was "Boulder". Three kites were on boulders, A, B and D. A and B were to the north, outside the control circle, and so D, the south-most boulder, was the correct answer.
2. A and C were deliberately placed in the upper parts of the two re-entrants so as to make it clear that D, simply "Re-entrant", was the correct answer. B was on the spur between the re-entrants.

3. This caused a lot of difficulty. B was a popular answer, and from the decision point it could be seen to be elevated, as though it was on the hill to the north, but it was elevated because it was on the earth bank – ruined wall intersection. Following the route to the Start around the east side of the hill and looking across to the kites along the earth bank or ruined wall would have shown this. C, the correct answer, was about 5m north of the ruined wall and just inside the form line around the southern part of the hill.
4. I admit this was a poor PreO control. I was struggling for a fourth problem. The problem itself was okay: A was in the minor water course coming in from the northwest, B was on the minor water course – stream junction, and C was on the stream - wall crossing, all about 10m apart. But having to look at these from about 150m away made it difficult to identify the features.
